REGULÆ GENERALES.

THE following rules are hereby established, for the despatch of business in the Supreme Court, during the year 1928:—

TERMS, HOLIDAYS, SITTINGS, AND VACATIONS.

1. The Terms, Holidays, Vacations, Circuits, and Sittings of the Court shall be those mentioned in the Law Almanac annexed hereto.

EQUITY.

2. The Court will sit for the hearing of witness causes in Equity on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, at 10 o'clock. Applications for injunction or for a receiver, or relating to the liberty of the subject, will be taken on any day at 10 o'clock. Company matters will be taken on Monday at 10 o'clock. All other matters in Equity will be taken on Friday at 10 o'clock, and on other days by leave of a Judge.

*See note under miscellaneous on last page of Almanac.

LUNACY.

3. Matters in Lunacy will be heard on Thursday, at 10 o'clock.

PROBATE MATTERS

4. Non-contentious Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge on Monday at 10 o'clock, or at such other times as he shall appoint. All other Probate matters will be taken by the Probate Judge at such times as he shall appoint.

BANKRUPTCY MATTERS.

5. The Judge in Bankruptcy will, unless he shall otherwise appoint, take the general bankruptcy business as follows:—
Motions under Section 134 on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday; all other matters on Wednesday and Thursday, at 10 o'clock.

CHAMBER BUSINESS.

6. Chamber business at Law may be taken on such days and at such times as may be ordered by a Judge; and unless otherwise ordered will be taken as follows:—

During Term and the Sittings for Trial of Causes.

- (1) Ordinary Chamber business—
- (a) Practice Work—on Mondays Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 9.30 a.m.
 - (b) Other single Judge applications—on Tuesdays and Thursdays, at 9.30 a.m.
- (2) Chamber business before the Prothonotary—on any day (except Saturday), at 9.30 a.m.

During Vacation.

On Wednesdays, at 10 a.m., or as may be directed.

SATURDAYS

7. There will be no sitting of the Court in Sydney on any Saturday unless the Court or a Judge otherwise directs.

GENERAL RULES APPLICABLE TO EVERY YEAR.

PRECEDENCE OF BUSINESS.

495. Unless otherwise ordered, matters for hearing before the Full Court shall be taken in accordance with the following directions:

- (a) Any matter which, in the opinion of the Court, should be disposed of immediately, may be heard forthwith or at such time as the Court appoints.
- (b) Criminal and other Crown cases will have precedence on Fridays.
- (c) Subject to the provisions of clause (a) hereof, Motions generally will have precedence on Mondays and Thursdays.

Subject to the preceding clauses, every matter in the Term paper will be heard in the order in which it is entered in the Term book.

CONTINUATION OF ORDERS.

314. Notice must be given to the Prothonotary, on or before the Saturday preceding the commencement of each Term, of all intended applications for continuation by the Court of orders made under and by virtue of the twentieth Section of the Act 1900. No. 35.

SETTING DOWN CAUSES AT LAW.

106. For each day of the sittings for Causes in Sydney there shall be three separate Cause Lists, which shall be taken respectively in the Banco, and in No. 1 and No. 2 Jury Courts.

107. To the extent limited for each day as next mentioned, causes shall be set down consecutively only. No more than four causes shall be set down in any list for any day for trial in Sydney by a Judge without a Jury, or by a Jury of four persons, nor more than one cause for trial by a Jury of twelve: Provided that an additional number of causes, not exceeding two, may be set down for any day, if the Prothonotary sees fit.

108. Until all Lists have been filled, in accordance with the last preceding Rule, no cause shall, except by leave of the Prothonotary, be set down in any list for any subsequent day.

JURIES OF TWELVE.

109. Provided that causes for trial by juries of twelve shall be set down for such days only as the Prothonotary shall in each case direct.

TRANSFERRING CAUSES.

110. Causes, on the List of any Court, may be transferred to the List of any other, by order of a Judge, for trial on the day next but one following, or any later day: Provided that no such day shall be earlier than that for which the cause was first entered.

CAUSES ON CIRCUIT.

111. Causes for trial in any Circuit Court shall be set down for the day fixed in the Law Almanac for holding such Circuit Court. But whenever it appears to the Chief Justice, or to the Judge intending to hold any Circuit Court, that it will not be convenient to hear the civil causes (if any) set down for trial at that Court on the day so fixed, the Chief Justice, or such Judge, may, not less than sixteen days before the day so fixed, appoint some other day for the trial of such causes, by direction to the Prothonotary; and the Prothonotary shall thereupon forthwith give notice of such appointment to the solicitors in the said causes or to their town agents, and also to the Sheriff; and all notices already given between the parties shall hold good and be applied to the day so specially appointed, and all notices and subpoenas to be thereafter given or issued shall be given or issued for that day.

127. If no civil cause has been set down and notice of trial given and notified to the Prothonotary for any Circuit Court, up to the sixteenth day before the day named in the Law Almanac for the trial of civil causes thereat, no jury shall be summoned to such Court for the trial of civil issues without the leave of a Judge, and the Prothonotary shall give notice to the Sheriff accordingly.

POSTPONEMENT.

113. When any Sittings for causes are postponed, the date for the trial of any cause, specially fixed, shall also be postponed for the same number of days as that for which the Sittings have been postponed, unless a Judge shall otherwise order.

CAUSES UNCONCLUDED DURING THE SITTINGS.

145. Any cause, not concluded on the last day of the Sittings, may be continued on such day or days as the presiding Judge thinks fit.

REMANETS.

114. All causes remaining untried at any Sittings shall be set down by the Prothonotary, each according to its appropriate list for the then next sittings; and no new notice of trial, or to produce documents, shall be necessary. Every such cause shall have precedence over causes previously set down for those Sittings.

APPLICATION FOR NEW TRIAL.

150. Every application for a nonsuit, or for a new trial, or in arrest of judgment, or for judgment *non obstante veredicto*, or for a *venire de novo*, or to enter a verdict, or to increase or reduce the amount of the verdict, shall be by notice of motion, and no *rule nisi* order to show cause or formal proceedings other than such notice of motion shall be made or taken.

The moving party shall within fourteen days after the trial file a notice of appeal, together with all affidavits to be used in support of such motion. Provided that any such affidavits may, by leave of the Court or a Judge, be filed at a later date.

151. Every such notice of motion shall state the day or days on which the cause was tried, the verdict given or other termination of the trial, the motion intended to be made, and the grounds on which it will be made; and when the party had counsel at the trial shall be signed by one of such counsel.

151A. A copy of every such notice of motion shall be left at the chambers of the Judge before whom the cause was tried on the day on which it is filed, and a copy thereof, and of any affidavit that may be filed in support thereof, shall on the day on which it is filed be served upon each opposing party or upon each solicitor on the record.

151B. (*Promulgated 15th September, 1925.*) No direction or omission to direct or decision as to the admission or rejection of evidence given by the Judge presiding at the trial shall, without the leave of the Court, be allowed as a ground for such notice of motion unless objection was taken at the trial to the direction, omission or decision by the party on whose behalf the notice of motion has been filed.

152. (*Rescinded by rule of 16th November, 1927, and the following substituted*):—

- (1) On or before the last day limited for filing such notice of motion the moving party shall order a copy of the notes of the evidence given at the trial and of the summing-up of the Judge.
- (2) Within fourteen days after receiving such copy or after being notified that it is available, such moving party shall file one and lodge three printed copies of such notes and summing-up, and of the pleadings, notice of appeal, and the exhibits, and shall within the same time serve four copies upon all parties upon whom a copy of the notice of motion is required to be served.
- (3) Upon the application of either party a Judge on such terms as he thinks fit may extend the times for ordering, filing, lodging or serving such printed copies, or may dispense with the ordering or printing of such notes, summing-up, pleadings, notice of appeal, and exhibits, or any of them or any portion of them respectively, and may direct a greater or less number of printed or other copies to be lodged or served as aforesaid.

154. Every such notice of motion shall be for the first day on which the Court sits in Banco after the expiration of sixteen days from the filing of such notice: Provided that no matter in which printed copies of the Judge's notes have to be filed and served shall be called on for hearing before such copies have been filed and served, or the time for so doing has expired, unless the Court or a Judge otherwise directs.

155. The moving party will be restricted upon the hearing to the grounds specified in the notice of motion.

157. The Associate of the Judge who tried the cause shall attend the Court on the hearing of the motion with the issues, exhibits, and other papers, and shall discharge thereafter the duties of the Prothonotary in respect of such motion until the same is disposed of.

PARTIES NOT READY TO PROCEED.

158. Where a notice of motion under Rule 150 hereof has been filed and no motion is made when the case is called on for hearing, the motion shall, unless the Court otherwise orders, be dismissed with costs.

STAY OF EXECUTION.

158A. Where any such notice of motion is filed it shall not operate as a stay of execution, except in cases where the Judge has reserved any point or given leave to move the Court in respect of any point.

VACATION BUSINESS.

9. During the Long Vacation, from the commencement thereof to the 31st January following, both days inclusive, except as hereinafter provided, time shall not run in any jurisdiction of the Court (except the Bankruptcy jurisdiction), nor shall any business other than that hereinafter specified be taken without the leave of a Judge; but time shall run after the said 31st January, and throughout the Short Vacation.

10. During the Long Vacation, from the commencement thereof to the 31st January following, both days inclusive—

- (a) In any action in which the Writ has been specially indorsed under the 24th section of the Common Law Procedure Act, 1899, unless the declaration includes counts in respect of causes of action not so indorsed, all steps and proceedings may be taken and time shall run at Law.
- (b) Causes may be set down, and notices of trial and to admit or produce documents may be given.
- (c) All Writs may be issued, executed, and returned.
- (d) Judgment may be signed in all cases in which the time which must expire before the same can be signed has expired before vacation begins.
- (e) Time shall run for putting in, excepting to and justifying bill.
- (f) Costs may be taxed in any case if the Taxing Officers deem it necessary.
- (g) All necessary proceedings may be taken for the purposes of an Appeal, or for obtaining or dissolving any injunction.

- (h) Summonses in cases of emergency may be returnable in Chambers on any Wednesday, or such other day as a Judge may appoint.

Every notice of motion for a new trial must be filed within the time limited by these Rules notwithstanding Vacation.

10A. (*Promulgated 28th October, 1925.*) During the Long Vacation (a) causes or matters declared urgent may be heard and disposed of, and time shall run in respect thereof; (b) all decrees nisi for the dissolution of marriage or for a declaration of nullity of marriage may be made absolute.

10b. (*Promulgated 28th October, 1925.*) (a) Any cause or matter may be declared urgent by a Judge—

- (i) which is in the nature of a test case;
 - (ii) the decision in which is likely to affect the settlement of other pending disputes or of matters likely to become disputes;
 - (iii) the decision in which may help in the construction of Acts or rules of general application;
 - (iv) where delay may seriously prejudice any of the parties or may cause serious inconvenience to the proposed witnesses;
 - (v) which in the opinion of the Judge to whom application is made requires to be immediately or promptly heard.
- (b) Application to have a cause or matter declared urgent may be made during the last seven days of the December sittings for the trial of Causes, or thereafter to the Vacation Judge.

(c) Every such application shall be by summons or notice of motion and shall be supported by an affidavit setting out the relevant facts and the grounds for the application.

(d) A list of urgent causes and matters shall be prepared and set down for hearing in such order as may be directed by the Vacation Judge.

CHAMBER BUSINESS

310. Every Summons returnable in Chambers shall be served on the party whose attendance is required before one o'clock of the afternoon preceding the return day, or if returnable on Monday, before one o'clock of the preceding Friday afternoon, unless a Judge otherwise orders.

336. No Chamber application will be entertained on any day in or out of Term, except in cases of emergency, after one o'clock.

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS

Friday, the 16th day of November, A.D. 1906.

In pursuance of all powers vested in us, or any of us, as members of the Barristers' Admission Board, or as Judge of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, we do order and direct as follows:—

1. These Rules shall come into force on the first day of December, 1906. Commencement.

2. All Rules heretofore made with reference to the examination and admission of candidates for admission as barristers are hereby rescinded: Provided that this rescission shall not affect anything done under the said Rules, and that all persons nominated, appointed, or admitted under the said Rules shall be deemed to have been nominated, appointed, or admitted under these Rules. Rescission of former rules.

3. In these Rules, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates or requires,— Interpretation.

“Barrister” means a barrister-at-law admitted by the Court;

“Board” means the board appointed under the Legal Practitioners' Act, 1898, for the approval of properly qualified persons to be barristers;

“Court” means the Supreme Court;

“Solicitor” means an attorney, solicitor, and proctor of the Court;

“Graduate” means a person who has taken any degree granted after examination in any university within the meaning of these Rules;

“University” means the University of Sydney or any university within the meaning of the Legal Practitioners' Act, 1898;

“Secretary” means the Secretary to the Board;

“Student-at-law” means any person who has been admitted by the Board with a view to his qualifying for admission as a barrister, whether his studentship has expired or not.

5. The Board shall meet in the Judges' consultation room on the first and last Wednesdays in each term, if required, or on such other dates as the Attorney-General may appoint.
6. At any meeting three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

- The Professor of Law of the University of Sydney and two practising barristers, or such other persons as may be approved, for the final examination in law;

8. All examiners may continue to act as examiners until their successors have been appointed.

Notice to Candidates for the Intermediate and Final Examinations in Law.

1. The English text-books prescribed for these examinations are, in a great measure, prescribed for the purpose of indicating the scope and subject matter of the examination; but, on all subjects where the law in force in New South Wales differs from the English law, candidates are required to make themselves acquainted with the law in force in New South Wales. Text-books, or parts of books which require to be read in connection with local statutes, are marked with an asterisk.

2. Candidates are reminded that English statutes, passed after the 25th July, 1828, are not in force in this State, except in cases where the enactment has been made binding by the Imperial Parliament, either expressly or by necessary implication. At the same time, a considerable number of English statutes passed after that date (such as the English Wills Act 1837), have been expressly adopted by the local legislature;

whilst a considerable number of local enactments have been based on similar enactments previously passed in the United Kingdom. As to how far law in force in England prior to 25th July, 1828, applies in New South Wales, reference may be made to Webb's "Imperial Law." As to how far English statutes have been adopted by, or embodied in, local legislation, reference may be made to Curlewis' "Tables of Statutes."

3. In cases where local statutes are expressly prescribed as subjects for examination, the examination will be confined, so far as possible, to the general tenor and essential or more important provisions of the statutes referred to; or, in other words, to such matters as would find a place in a student's text-book. The English text-books will serve, to some extent, as a guide in this matter.

4. Candidates are reminded that the State laws on some of the subjects included in these examinations are liable to be superseded by Federal legislation; whilst on other subjects the existing Acts may be displaced by Consolidated Acts. Candidates are further reminded that they are liable to be examined in any Acts or Rules relating to the subjects of these examinations passed or made by either the State or the Federal Parliament more than six calendar months prior to the date at which such examinations may be held.

5. Candidates are also advised, prior to entering on their studies for the final examination, to make themselves acquainted with the general tenor of both the Interpretation Act, 1897 (New South Wales), and the Acts Interpretation Act, 1901 (Commonwealth); whilst they are also reminded that the interpretation of Imperial statutes, applicable in either State or Commonwealth, is governed by the Interpretation Act, 1889 (Imperial).

6. Where chapters, sections, or pages are referred to, the reference is to be deemed "inclusive," unless otherwise expressed.

Preliminary Examination for Articled Clerks.

The preliminary examination for intending articled clerks is the Matriculation examination of the University of Sydney in the subjects qualifying for matriculation and entrance to the Faculty of Law or the Faculty of Medicine.

The compulsory subjects in which candidates are required to pass are the following:—

- (1) English.
- (2) Mathematics.
- (3) Latin.
- (4) One of the following:—Greek, French, German, or Japanese.

In addition to the above compulsory subjects, candidates may elect to take History or Mechanics or a prescribed Science subject.

Candidates must pass at the higher standard in three subjects, of which (a) one must be English, and (b) one must be Latin, Greek, French, German, or Japanese.

The whole examination must be passed at one sitting.

Candidates may present themselves for the February Matriculation Examination or the Leaving Certificate Examination.

Particulars of the times, place, and subjects of examination may be obtained from the Calendar of the University of Sydney, or on application to the Registrar of the University of Sydney.

Notice of intention to sit must be given, and the examination fee (£3) paid, to the Registrar.

The Matriculation Examination is held annually during the month of February. Entries close for the Examination at the University during the first week in February.

ance of any work, such percentage shall be calculated upon such fixed amount, except in cases where the amount of payments included therein exceeds 15s.

- (3) Such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business whether the taxation proceeds between party and party, as between solicitor and client, or between solicitor and client.
- (4) This Rule shall not apply to the assessment of any gross sum under Rule 59 of these Rules, and shall not affect the question whether one-sixth has been taxed off a bill of costs.

RULES UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1919.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in us we do order and direct as follows:—

- In the following Rules, unless the context or subject-matter otherwise indicates or requires:—
 - “Court” means the Supreme Court of New South Wales.
 - “Appeal Court” means the Court of Petty Sessions, or the District Court against whose decision an appeal is being made.
 - “Appellant” means the party to a cause or matter who is appealing to the Court.
 - “Respondent” means any other party to a cause or matter.
- Any party desirous of appealing under Clause 20 of the provisions in the Third schedule to the Local Government Act, 1919, to the Court from the decision of an Appeal Court shall, with sixteen days from the said decision, apply in writing to the said Appeal Court to state and sign a case for the opinion of the Court.
- The Appellant shall, within seven days of receiving the case, serve notice in writing of such an appeal, together with a copy of the case as stated and signed, on the respondent, and shall thereafter and within the said time transmit such case to the Prothonotary of the Court.

4. When a special case from any Appeal Court has been transmitted to the Prothonotary it shall be filed and set down for hearing before the Court on a day not less than seven days from the filing thereof, unless the written consent of both parties to the case being heard at an earlier date is filed.
5. As soon as the case is filed a notice thereof shall be served by the appellant upon the respondent or his solicitor.
6. All notices and other documents which by these Rules have to be served upon any party to the proceedings may be served by being left with the party or his solicitor, or the Sydney agent of such solicitor, or by being sent through the post in a prepaid registered envelope addressed to such party at his last known place of abode.
7. The Court or a Judge thereof may at all times upon such terms and conditions as to costs or otherwise as it or he thinks fit—
 - (1) enlarge or abridge the times allowed under these Rules for the doing of any act; and
 - (2) amend any proceedings or any case, notice, order, affidavit, or other document coming within the provisions of these Rules.

Provided that any enlargement of time may be ordered although the application for the same is not made until after the expiration of the time allowed.

- Service. (2.) As soon as conveniently may be, a copy of the statement of facts together with notice of the day for which it is set down for hearing shall be served by the Crown Solicitor upon the appellant and the State Superannuation Board respectively. Such service may be by post.
- Additional facts. (3.) Upon application to the Judge any admitted facts may be added to the statement of facts.
- Inquiry as to acts. (4.) The Judge may determine, or may direct an inquiry by the Prothonotary or any other person to determine, any disputed questions of fact.
- Notification of opinion. (5.) Upon the determination by a Judge of the matter referred to him, the Prothonotary shall cause the Notice of Appeal, together with a minute of the Judge's opinion thereon, to be transmitted to the Minister.
- Interpretation. (6.) In these rules the term "Judge" shall mean a Judge of the Supreme Court and shall not include the Prothonotary.

Rule 73 of the General Rules published in the Government Gazette of the 25th July, 1899, regulating the practice and procedure of the Supreme Court of New South Wales in its Probate Jurisdiction, is hereby rescinded and the following Rule is passed in place thereof :—

73. (1) The following scale shall be taken as the standing scale of costs to be allowed to solicitors in connection with the obtaining grants of probate and letters of administration where no contention has arisen (such scale to include costs of any necessary briefs and all disbursements but not to include the costs incurred in satisfying the requisitions of the Commissioner of Stamp Duties upon the affidavit and inventory required under the Stamp Duties Act, 1898), and no further costs shall be allowed as a charge against an estate :—

Where the net value of the estate as sworn to in the stamp affidavit does not exceed £500	10 pounds
Over £500, but not exceeding £1,000	12 guineas
Over £1,000, but not exceeding £2,000	15 guineas
Over £2,000, but not exceeding £5,000	18 guineas
Over £5,000, but not exceeding £10,000	25 guineas
Over £10,000	30 guinea.

Provided that in all cases in which the net value of the estate as aforesaid exceeds £500 a solicitor may deliver a bill of costs to the executor or administrator and cause the same to be submitted for taxation and the amount of such bill when so taxed and no more shall be a charge upon the estate of the deceased, but if after taxation the amount of such bill, exclusive of the cost of submitting the same for taxation, does not exceed the respective sums set out in the above scale the cost of submitting the bill for taxation shall be paid by the solicitor.

- (2) In cases in which the net value of the estate as aforesaid does not exceed £500 the Court may in any case where the work has been of exceptional length or difficulty, give leave to the solicitor to tax his bill o

costs, and the terms of the above proviso shall in that case apply to such bill. Such leave may be obtained by the solicitor leaving at the Chambers of the Probate Judge the bill of costs required to be taxed together with an affidavit showing the exceptional circumstances upon which he relies.

- (3) This Rule shall come into force upon the 1st day of December, 1920.

4. (a) Upon receipt by the Prothonotary of a certificate of authenticity in relation to a Commission Rogatoire a Judge may make all such orders as may be necessary to give effect to such commission.

(b) The Judge, officer, or other person before whom the examination of a witness or witnesses is to be held shall fix the time and place for holding the examination.

(e) The Prothonotary shall forward the Commission Rogatoire, the order for examination, the depositions of the witnesses, and the certificates hereinbefore referred to, to the consular authority of France in Sydney.

(f) The Prothonotary shall notify the consular authority of France in Sydney of the time and place appointed for the examination or of the person appointed to take the examination.

(g) An order for examination of witnesses hereunder may be in Form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto with such variations as circumstances may require.

5. (a) Upon receipt of a request from the consular authority of France for the appointment under Article 8 of some person to take evidence, the Prothonotary may apply to a Judge for such appointment.

(b) If the person so appointed desires to obtain an order for the attendance of any witness or the production of any document he may apply to the Crown Solicitor who may thereupon, with the consent of the Attorney-General, make such applications and take such steps as may be necessary to procure the attendance of such witness or the production of such document.

6. In cases where a Judge is satisfied that the requirements of the Convention have been complied with substantially, if not literally, he may make all such orders as may be necessary to ensure effective service of the documents or an effective examination of the witnesses.

7. The foregoing rules, as far as they are applicable, shall apply to all requests for service or Commissions Rogatoires which have been addressed to the High Court or to any Supreme Court of any State, and, because of want of jurisdiction in the Court to which they are addressed, have been forwarded to the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

1. Applications to register judgments of British Dominions other than Australasia shall be by summons in chambers.

2. The application shall be supported by an affidavit of the facts stating that to the best of the information and belief of the deponent the judgment creditor is entitled to enforce the judgment and that the judgment does not come within the provisions of section 5 (2) of the Administration of Justice Act, 1924. The affidavit must also, so far as the deponent can, give the full name, title, trade, or business, and the usual or last known place of abode or business of the judgment creditor and judgment debtor respectively. A duly authenticated copy of the judgment must be annexed to the affidavit.

3. The summons shall unless otherwise ordered be served in the same manner as a writ of summons is served.

4. The order giving leave to register the judgment shall state the time within which the judgment debtor is entitled to apply to set aside the registration, but need not be served except in cases where the judgment debtor has appeared on the application. Such time shall not be less than fourteen days after service of the notice of registration unless in exceptional circumstances the Judge sees fit to make the time shorter.

5. The Register of Judgments shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto No 1.

6. Notice in writing of the registration of the judgment must, unless otherwise ordered, be served personally on the judgment debtor.

7. Such notice may be in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule and shall contain full particulars of the judgment registered, the name and address of the judgment creditor or of his solicitor or agent, the address (which must be within 2 miles of the General Post Office) where any summons issued by the judgment debtor may be served. The notice shall also state that the judgment debtor may apply to set aside the registration of the judgment provided he makes the application within so many days after service of the notice as has been limited by the order giving leave to register, and must state the specific number of days allowed.

8. The person serving the notice shall within three days after such service endorse on the notice or a copy or duplicate thereof the day of the month and week of the service thereof whether such service was personal or not, otherwise execution may not issue on the judgment. Every affidavit of service of such notice shall specify the day on which such endorsement was made. In special circumstances such three days may be extended by order of the Court or a Judge even though the three days have elapsed before such order is made.

9. After service of the notice the judgment debtor may within the time limited by the order giving leave to register the judgment or thereafter by leave of the Court or Judge apply by summons to set aside the registration or to suspend execution on the judgment and the Court or Judge may make such order as to it or him seems just.

10. No execution shall issue on a judgment ordered to be registered until after the expiration of the time limited for applying to have the registration set aside, and until after an affidavit of service of the notice of registration has been filed.

11. Any such execution may be set aside or suspended in the same manner and upon the same grounds as an execution on any other judgment or order of the Court may be set aside.

12. When any such execution has been issued the rules and practice regulating interpleader proceedings in respect of any other execution shall apply.

13. The term "execution" under these rules shall include proceedings for the attachment of debts owing to the judgment debtor.

14. When leave to register a judgment has been given, the judgment shall be registered in that jurisdiction of the Court in which a similar judgment or order might have been obtained.

2. The following headings, sub-titles, rules and forms are substituted in their place:—

1. *The Trustee Act, 1925.*

(a) Payment in of Trust Funds.

302. Any application to the Court for the exercise of the powers under Part IV of the Trustee Act, 1925, shall be made by summons at Chambers unless the Court in any matter otherwise directs.

303. Where a person desires to make payment into Court under Part IV of such Act he shall make and file an affidavit entitled in the matter of the trust (described so as to be distinguishable) and in the matter of Part IV of the Trustee Act, 1925, and setting forth—

(1) His own name and address.

- (2) A place of service (which shall not be more than one mile from the Equity Office), where he may be served with any notice of any application, proceeding, or order relating to the Trust Fund.
- (3) The amount of the moneys, stock, or securities paid, transferred, or deposited.
- (4) A short description of the trust, and of the instrument creating it.
- (5) The names and places of residence of the persons, interested in or entitled to the money, stock, or securities, to the best of his knowledge and belief; and
- (6) His submission to answer all such inquiries relating to the application of the money, stock or securities, paid, transferred, or deposited, as the Court may make or direct.

304. (1) All money, stock and securities paid or transferred into Court under Part IV of such Act shall be deemed to be money, stock and securities in Court within the meaning of Part XXVI of these Rules.

(2) Where any person desires to transfer stock or securities into Court under such Act, he shall at the time of filing the aforesaid affidavit, apply to the Master in Equity for directions with regard to such transfer.

305. The person making the lodgment shall forthwith give notice thereof by prepaid letter through the post to the several persons whose names and places of residence are stated in his affidavit as interested in or entitled to the money, stock, or securities, unless such persons are infants, lunatics, insane or incapable persons or insane patients, in which case such notice shall be sent to the persons on whom service might in such case be effected under rules 57 and 58.

306. Any of the persons so named in the affidavit or the person making the lodgment or any person claiming an interest in the moneys, stock, or securities may apply to the Court for the exercise of its powers, under section 98 of such Act, and notice of any such application shall be served by the applicant upon the person who made the lodgment (when not the applicant) and the persons whose names and places of residence are stated in the affidavit, unless the Court otherwise directs.

(b) *Investment and Payment Out.*

307. Every applicant shall state in his summons a place for service (which shall not be more than one mile from the Equity Office) where he may be served with notice of any application, proceeding, or order relating to the Trust Fund

308. All affidavits, applications and proceedings shall be entitled in the same manner as the affidavit upon which the lodgment was made.

309. Where the facts or some of the facts upon, which an applicant in any matter under Part IV of such Act relies, have already been stated in an affidavit or affidavits in that matter and such applicant has no reason to believe that such statement is untrue or that any respondent to his application will dispute the truth of such statement, he may in his summons give notice that he intends to refer to such affidavit or affidavits, and unless the Court thinks that the applicant is justified in proving or deposing to such facts again on the ground of convenience, or as a saving of expense, the costs of so doing will be disallowed on taxation.

(c) Petition or Summons for Advice.

310. (1) All summonses, appointments, and statements and other proceedings under section 63 of the Trustee Act, 1925, shall be entitled in the matter of the particular trust, will, or administration, and in the matter of the said Act, and shall be filed in the Equity Office.

(2) Every such statement shall state the facts concisely and shall be divided into paragraphs numbered consecutively, and shall state the questions upon which the opinion, advice or direction of the Judge or the Master in Equity is required.

(3) Every such summons shall be in the form or to the effect of the Form No. 14 in the Schedule to these Rules.

(4) Every such appointment shall be in the form or to the effect of the Form No. 14 (a) in the Schedule to these Rules.

(5) At the time of the filing of any such summons or appointment, the statement upon which the same is grounded shall be filed in the Equity Office.

311. The opinion, advice, or direction of the Judge or Master shall be settled, passed, and entered, and remain on record in the same manner as any order of the Court.

312. Unless the Judge or Master otherwise orders applications to the Court under subclause 10 of section 63 of the Trustee Act, 1925, shall be made within twenty-one days after receipt of a notice under subsection (8) of the said section, or after the passing and entry of the opinion, advice, or direction whichever may be the later date.

313. (1) An appeal to the Full Court from the opinion, advice, or direction of the Judge or Master, or from the order or direction of the Court may be filed within twenty-one days after the passing and entry of the opinion, advice, or direction of the Judge or Master, or of the order or directions of the Court.

(2) The practice regulating appeals from a decree of the Judge to the Full Court under the Equity Act, 1901, shall apply to such appeals.

(d) New Trustees and Vesting Orders.

314. (1) Upon an application for the appointment of a new trustee under Part III of the Trustee Act, 1925, the evidence to support the same shall show—

- (a) the nature of the trusts still subsisting;
- (b) the nature and value of the property subject to such trusts, and in particular whether any and what portion of the real estate is subject to the Real Property Act;
- (c) the person beneficially entitled;
- (d) the fitness of the proposed new trustee; and
- (e) the consent of the proposed new trustee, signed by him, and verified by affidavit.

(2) Every application for an order under Part III of such Act, shall be entitled in the matter of the particular trust and of the said Act, and shall specify the sections and subsections of the Act under which it is proposed that the order shall be made.

(3) Unless the Court otherwise orders, it shall not be necessary to file more than one affidavit of the fitness of the proposed new trustee; such affidavit to state the position in life of the proposed new trustee, how long the deponent has known the proposed new trustee, and that the proposed new trustee is, to the knowledge of the deponent, of good credit, and is, to the best of his information and belief, a person of good character and repute, and of business habits.

(4) All orders made upon any summons under Part III of the Trustee Act, 1925, shall be settled, passed, and entered in the same manner as any order made by the Court.

(e) Temporary Investment of Trust Funds.

315. The following banks or corporations are prescribed as banks or corporations to which trust moneys may be paid under section 15 of the Trustee Act, 1925, viz. :—

We do order and direct that the following Rules shall come in operation forthwith :—

1. Rule 61 of the Rules of 22nd December, 1902, is hereby rescinded, and the following Rule substituted :—

61. (1) *The defendant, or by leave of a Judge one of several defendants, may set up by way of cross action, any right or claim against the plaintiff whether it sound in damages or not, and whether it arise out of the same subject matter as the claim of the plaintiff or not, and final judgment may be given in the same action both on the original claim and on the cross claim.*

(2) *A plea of set-off may be in the following form or to the like effect :—*

The defendant, for a plea of set-off says that the plaintiff is indebted to the defendant for money payable by the plaintiff to the defendant for &c. And the defendant claims £

A plea of cross action may be in the following form or to the like effect :—

The defendant for a plea of cross action says that it was agreed &c (or) that the plaintiff broke and entered, &c. (as in a declaration). And the defendant claims £

(3) *Every plea of set off or cross action, unless the contrary is stated, shall be deemed to be in respect of matters arising before action.*

(4) *Where the declaration contains any count the pleas to which are required to be verified, no plea of set-off or cross action shall, unless a Judge otherwise orders, be filed without an affidavit that the plea and the particulars thereunder, if any, are true in substance and in fact, or an affidavit of such facts in verification as a Judge shall deem sufficient in that behalf.*

(5) *A Judge may direct any issue under a plea of set-off or cross action to be separately tried, or may disallow the cross action if in his opinion it cannot be conveniently disposed of in the pending action, or ought not to be allowed, or may make such other order and impose such terms in respect thereof as he thinks fit.*

2. *The following Rule shall stand as Rule 89A of the said Rules :—*

89A. (1) *In any action for debt or damages, any defendant may, together with a defence denying liability, pay money into Court, in satisfaction of the plaintiff's claim or any part thereof.*

(2) *If the plaintiff accepts the sum so paid into Court in satisfaction of the claim in respect of which it has been paid in, he shall be entitled to have the money paid out to him, and all further proceedings in respect of such claim, except as to costs, shall be stayed.*

(3) If the plaintiff does not so accept the said sum, the money shall remain in Court, and shall not be paid out except upon the order of the Court or a Judge.

(4) Such order may be made at any time before or at or after the trial of the action, but shall not, except on special grounds, be made until after taxation of the costs of the action.

(5) If the plaintiff proceeds with the action in respect of such claim, or any part thereof, and recovers a sum equal to or less than the sum paid into Court, the amount so recovered, together with any costs, due to the plaintiff in respect thereof, shall be credited to the plaintiff, and the balance shall be credited to the defendant.

(6) Upon the order of the Court or a Judge, the money shall be paid to the party entitled after setting off damages and costs allowed to either party, and after proper credits have been given for all sums recovered by or ordered to be paid to either party.

(7) The plaintiff may, in answer to a set-off or cross action pay money into Court, with or without a denial of liability, subject to the same conditions, *mutatis mutandis*, as in the case of payment into Court by a defendant.

(8) Where money has been paid into Court with a denial of liability, the pleadings relating to such payment in shall not be included in the issues for trial, and no communication shall be made to the jury (until after verdict) of the fact that money has been paid into Court. The jury shall be required to find the amount of debt or damages, as the case may be, without reference to such payment in.

3. The following Rule shall stand as Rule 5A of the Rules of the 12th day of August, 1912 :—

5A. No fresh evidence shall be given upon any such reference unless the Judge before whom it is heard otherwise orders.

4. The following Rule is added to the Rules of 22nd December, 1902, as number 501 :—

501. (1) Where an order is registered in the Supreme Court under the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1923, the proper officer of the Supreme Court shall forward all papers lodged with him, other than those required for registration, to the Crown Solicitor who may thereupon, with the consent of the Attorney-General, make such application and take such steps as may be necessary to enforce such order.

(2) Upon the consent of the Attorney-General being obtained, the Crown Solicitor shall be deemed to be the legal representative of the party in whose favour such order was made or given unless and until some Solicitor is appointed in his place.

407C. (1) Upon request being made by any Solicitor for the execution of any process or for any work for which fees are properly chargeable in the Sheriff's Office, the Sheriff may require a deposit of money to meet such fees. He may also require an undertaking in writing to pay any further fees which may become payable beyond the amount so deposited.

(2) In any case in which any Solicitor has deposited an amount in excess of the fees which shall be found to be payable, the Sheriff shall, upon the amount actually payable being ascertained, return to the said Solicitor the amount so deposited in excess.

(3) Where execution has been levied upon any property and the Sheriff upon request has withdrawn from such property, the execution creditor or his Solicitor shall, upon being requested in writing so to do, furnish the Sheriff with full particulars of any arrangement arrived at between the execution creditor and the execution debtor or with any person on behalf of such debtor.

(4) In the event of the execution creditor or his Solicitor failing to comply with the written request of the Sheriff for such particulars within fourteen days from the date thereof, the Sheriff shall be deemed to have recovered the full amount which he was required to levy under the writ of execution lodged with him, and poundage upon such full amount shall become forthwith due and payable by such Solicitor.

(5) Upon default being made by any Solicitor in payment of fees properly chargeable in the Sheriff's Office for a period of seven days after demand in writing by the Sheriff, he may report to the Court the name of the Solicitor so making default, and the Court may thereupon make all necessary orders to enforce payment of such fees, and the Sheriff may, with the consent of the Attorney-General, commit to the Crown Solicitor the conduct of such matter.

THE Poor Persons Rules of 1919 are hereby repealed, and the following rules, which may be cited as the Poor Persons Rules, 1927, shall apply so far as may be practicable to all proceedings taken in all actions and matters pending on the 1st day of September, on which day these rules shall come into force.

1. (1) Any person may be permitted to take, defend, or be a party to any legal proceedings or to continue such proceedings in the Supreme Court of New South Wales as a poor person on satisfying the Court or a Judge that he has reasonable grounds for taking, defending, or being a party to such proceedings, and that he is not worth £50, excluding his wearing apparel, tools of trade, necessary furniture to a value not exceeding £20, and the subject-matter of such proceedings.

(2) In special circumstances similar permission may be given to an applicant who is worth more than £50.

2. (1) The prescribed officer under these rules shall be, in respect of proceedings in—

- (i) The Equitable Jurisdiction of the Court, the Master in Equity, or the Deputy Registrar;
- (ii) the Bankruptcy Jurisdiction of the Court, the Registrar in Bankruptcy;
- (iii) the Probate Jurisdiction of the Court, the Registrar of Probates;
- (iv) the Lunacy Jurisdiction of the Court, the Master in Lunacy or the Deputy Master; and in
- (v) all other jurisdictions, the Prothonotary or the Deputy Prothonotary.

(2) The expression "Officer in Charge" shall mean the Officer in Charge of the Legal Aid Office.

3. (1) The prescribed officers shall keep a list of counsel willing to inquire into and report upon the application of any person for such permission.

(2) The prescribed officers shall keep a list of solicitors and counsel willing to assist poor persons in the conduct of proceedings.

4. A person desirous of obtaining such permission shall lodge with the officer in charge an application in the form or to the effect of the form in the Schedule hereto.

Such application shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the applicant that the statements of facts therein contained are to the best of his knowledge, information, and belief true and correct.

5. (1) Where the applicant is an infant, the application and statutory declaration shall be made on his behalf by a next friend, who shall be required to satisfy the Officer in Charge that both he and the infant are persons whose means are respectively such as to qualify them to be admitted to take or defend or be a party to legal proceedings under these rules.

(2) In such cases the Officer in Charge shall report through the prescribed officer to the Court or Judge as to the means and circumstances of the parents or other persons by whom the infant is maintained.

(3) Nothing in these Rules shall affect the practice of the Supreme Court, in its Equitable Jurisdiction, on directions for inquiries whether any proceedings in the said Court are for the benefit of the infant.

6. The Officer in Charge shall inquire into every application lodged with him, and shall report to the Court, through the prescribed officer, whether and upon what terms the applicant should be allowed to proceed.

7. The Officer in Charge may—

- (1) make such inquiries as he thinks fit as to the means and position of the applicant, and as to the merits of the case;
- (2) require the attendance of the applicant;
- (3) hear any other person;
- (4) require facts to be proved by affidavit or statutory declaration;
- (5) refer the application to one or more solicitors or to one or more counsel, whether named in the list to be kept pursuant to Rule 3 or not, to obtain the facts and an opinion thereon;
- (6) to give an applicant such legal advice in connection with the subject-matter of the application as may be necessary;
- (7) in the event of his being a solicitor, take or cause such step to be taken as may be necessary to conserve the rights of an applicant, pending the determination of his application, provided that no proceedings other than by way of appeal shall be instituted in any Court without leave of a Judge thereof, and
- (8) defray expenses incidental to such inquiries from the established fund under his control.

8. The report and any documents or information obtained for the purposes of the report shall be treated as confidential and shall not be shown to the parties, or either of them, nor to any counsel or solicitor for either of such parties, except to such extent and upon such conditions as the prescribed officer directs.

9. (1) Upon the production of such report the Court or a Judge may, upon such terms, if any, as it or he thinks fit, make an order allowing the applicant to take, continue, defend, or to be a party to legal proceedings as a poor person in accordance with these rules, whereupon the prescribed officer shall assign to the applicant a solicitor willing to act in the matter, and counsel to assist him in the conduct of the proceedings as a poor person, and, where such solicitor practises in a country town, shall also assign a solicitor in Sydney who is willing to act as agent for such solicitor.

(2) Where the officer in charge is a solicitor the prescribed officer may assign him as solicitor for the applicant—

- (i) in cases where no other suitable solicitor is willing to act;

- (ii) in cases of urgency or necessity to preserve the rights of a "poor person."

10. The applicant shall not, without the leave of a Judge—

- (1) discharge any solicitor or counsel assigned to him, or
- (2) appeal against the refusal of the Court or a Judge to make an order allowing him to take, continue, defend, or be a party to proceedings as a poor person.

11. A solicitor or counsel assigned to assist in the conduct of proceedings shall not discontinue his assistance without the leave of a Judge or of the prescribed officer: Provided, however, that any such solicitor or counsel may be represented by any other solicitor or counsel.

12. In considering whether an order to take legal proceedings under these rules shall be made, the Judge may consider the question whether such proceedings could be taken in an inferior Court.

13. Any order allowing an applicant so to proceed as a poor person may be discharged by the Court or a Judge, whether any application for that purpose has been made or not.

14. Except as is otherwise provided by these Rules, no person in whose favour such an order has been made shall be liable to pay any Court fees or costs to any other party; and no person shall take, or agree to take, or seek to obtain any fees, profit, or reward either for inquiry and report or for the conduct of proceedings.

15. Any persons taking, or agreeing to take, or seeking to obtain any fee or reward for inquiry and report, or for the conduct of proceedings otherwise than as aforesaid, shall be guilty of contempt of court, and the promise or giving of any such fee, profit, or reward shall be sufficient ground for refusing or discharging an order to proceed as a poor person, but in special cases the Court or a Judge may, notwithstanding such promise or gift, grant an order to proceed as a poor person or refuse to discharge such an order.

16. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, a solicitor may receive from any poor person, or out of the fund established for that purpose, the out-of-pocket expenses incurred by him. Applications for such expenses, out of such fund, shall be made to the Officer in Charge.

17. Costs payable, or ordered to be paid, to a poor person under any judgment or order shall include only out-of-pocket expenses.

18. Any out-of-pocket expenses which may have been paid out of any fund as aforesaid, if recovered from any other party to the proceedings, shall be repaid to such fund.

19. Every notice of motion, summons, or petition on behalf of a person who has obtained an order to proceed as a poor person shall be signed by his solicitor, who shall take care that no application is made without reasonable cause.

20. When a cause or matter is heard in any jurisdiction of the Court, no person who has obtained an order to proceed as a poor person shall appeal to the Full Court as a poor person without leave of a Judge.

21. Application for such leave may be made on the conclusion of the hearing of the cause or matter, or later. If made later it shall be so made within the time limited for giving notice of appeal, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from the applicant's counsel, or solicitor if unrepresented by counsel, that there is good ground for appealing.

22. (1) Any person who has not previously obtained leave to proceed in any Court as a poor person may apply for leave to appeal to the Full Court or to oppose such appeal as a poor person in the same manner as he would apply for leave to institute an action in the Supreme Court.

(2) The application should be accompanied by a certificate from the applicant's counsel, or from his solicitor if unrepresented by counsel, or from some other counsel, if he was unrepresented by counsel or solicitor in the Court below, that there is good ground for appealing or for opposing the appeal.

23. Application for leave to appeal to the Supreme Court from an inferior Court when such applicant has been proceeding as a poor person in such inferior Court, shall be made to a Judge within the time limited for instituting an appeal, and may be granted if accompanied by a certificate from the applicant's counsel, or solicitor if unrepresented by counsel, that there is good ground for appealing.

24. Any person who has obtained leave to institute or defend proceedings as a poor person in any Court may oppose as a poor person any appeal from the result of such proceedings in the Court below.

25. Except as by these Rules specifically provided, nothing in these Rules shall operate as a stay of proceedings unless so ordered by the Court or a Judge.

26. No person who has obtained an order to proceed as a poor person, either personally or by his counsel or solicitor, shall, without the leave of the Court or a Judge, discontinue, settle, or compromise the proceedings.

27. Any application to set a cause down for hearing in the Supreme Court shall be made on summons or in such manner as a Judge may in any case direct.

28. Except as is herein otherwise provided, these Rules shall not apply to proceedings in the Criminal, Bankruptcy, or Matrimonial Causes Jurisdictions.

29. These Rules shall apply to proceedings in the Bankruptcy Jurisdiction in respect of applications—

- (1) under section 134 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1898, and
- (2) by way of appeal from any judgment or order of the Court, Judge, or Registrar.

30. In the Matrimonial Causes Jurisdiction the practice and procedure relative to the granting permission to persons to take or defend proceedings *in forma pauperis* shall be regulated by the Rules in force for the time being in that Jurisdiction, with the following additions:—

- (1) The Registrar may grant an order to the applicant (including a co-respondent) to defend a suit *in forma pauperis*, whether the petitioner has or has not obtained an order to proceed *in forma pauperis* and
- (2) the amount which such applicant must show he is not worth shall be £50 or such larger sum as the Judge in special cases directs.

31. (1) Where litigation has been instituted the lodging of an application with the Officer in Charge shall operate as a stay of all proceedings for a period of fourteen days unless otherwise ordered.

(2) The time during which proceedings are to be stayed may be either reduced or extended by order of a Judge.

32. Where an application to defend proceedings, to continue proceedings, or to institute proceedings by way of appeal has been lodged with the Officer in Charge, he shall forthwith notify the other party to such proceedings.

33. Where a person has been admitted to proceed and defend or be a party to proceedings in accordance with these Rules, the counsel or solicitor appearing on behalf of such person shall be entitled, during the conduct of the case, to a copy of any shorthand notes taken and transcribed by the official shorthand-writer, without any charge.

34. When an application to institute proceedings has been lodged with the Officer in Charge, he shall notify the other party to the proposed proceedings when practicable, and at the same time inform such other party that if it is desired to disclose matter in opposition the same may be disclosed to the Officer in Charge or to the prescribed officer named in such notice, and in the latter event such prescribed officer shall report upon the matter so disclosed to the Court, and treat the matter as confidential, and it shall not be regarded as documents or information obtained for the purposes of the report.

THE following Rules are hereby promulgated as Rule 504:—

504. (1) In an action of ejectment the claimant may, together with the praecipe for the writ, file particulars of claim. A copy of such particulars, endorsed with a notice that the claimant requires the defendant to give particulars of defence, shall be served with the writ.

(2) The particulars of claim shall be a statement in summary form of the material facts upon which the claimant relies for his claim; but not the evidence by which they are to be proved. Where seisin in fee is a material fact, it shall be sufficient to state that any person was or is seised in fee, without showing how he became so seised.

(3) Where particulars of claim have been given, the defendant shall file and serve with the notice of appearance particulars of defence.

(4) The particulars of defence shall be a statement in summary form of the material facts upon which the defendant relies for his defence, but not the evidence by which they are to be proved, and may include an admission or denial of any material statement in the particulars of claim. The defendant shall be taken to admit any such statement that is not denied.

(5) If the defendant is in possession by himself or his tenant, it shall not be necessary for him to give particulars of his title, but, except as hereinafter mentioned, it shall be sufficient for him to state that he is so in possession.

(6) If it appears by the particulars of claim that the action is brought by the registered proprietor of any land, or by a mortgagee against a mortgagor, or by a landlord against a tenant, to recover possession of the

whole or part of the land described in the certificate of title or mortgaged or leased as the case may be, the particulars of defence shall contain a statement of any defence upon which the defendant relies other than a denial of statements in the particulars of claim.

(7) After appearance, whether particulars have already been given or not, either party shall, if a Judge so orders, give particulars or further or better particulars of claim or of defence.

(8) Where particulars have been given by either party, the other party may, within eight days after service thereof, file and serve a denial of any material statement in such particulars, or an admission of any such statement with or without further particulars relating to the matter so denied or admitted. He shall be taken to admit any such statement that is not denied.

(9) If the particulars of claim required by these rules are not duly given, or if the particulars given show that the claimant has no right to the possession of the property, a Judge may order proceedings in the action to be stayed or the writ to be set aside.

(10) If the particulars of defence required by these rules are not duly given, or if the particulars given show that the defendant has no defence at law, a Judge may strike out the appearance.

(11) If the claimant seeks to recover mesne profits, he shall indorse a notice of his claim upon the writ.

(12) Any writ, indorsement, notice or particulars may be amended, and the time for doing anything under these rules may be extended, whether such time has expired or not, by the order of a Judge.

(13) A Judge may order to be struck out or amended any matter in the particulars of claim or defence which may be unnecessary or may tend to prejudice, embarrass, or delay the fair trial of the action.

(14) The forms in the Schedule or forms to the like effect may be used.

1. Rules 152, 169, and 170 of the Rules of the 22nd December, 1902, are hereby rescinded, and the following Rules substituted:—

152 (1) On or before the last day limited for filing such notice of motion, the moving party shall order a copy of the notes of the evidence given at the trial, and of the summing-up of the Judge.

(2) Within fourteen days after receiving such copy, or after being notified that it is available, such moving party shall file one and lodge three printed copies of such notes and summing-up, and of the pleadings, notice of appeal, and the exhibits, and shall within the same time serve four copies upon all parties upon whom a copy of the notice of motion is required to be served.

(3) Upon the application of either party, a Judge on such terms as he thinks fit may extend the times for ordering, filing, lodging, or serving such printed copies, or may dispense with the ordering or printing of such notes, summing-up, pleadings, notice of appeal, and exhibits, or any of them

or any portion of them respectively, and may direct a greater or less number of printed or other copies to be lodged or served as aforesaid.

169. No party to an action in whose favour a verdict has been given, a non-suit granted, or a judgment directed to be entered, shall, except by leave of the Court or a Judge, sign or enter final judgment until after the expiration of fourteen days from such verdict, non-suit, or direction.

170. Such leave may be subject to such terms and conditions as to the Court or Judge seems fit.
